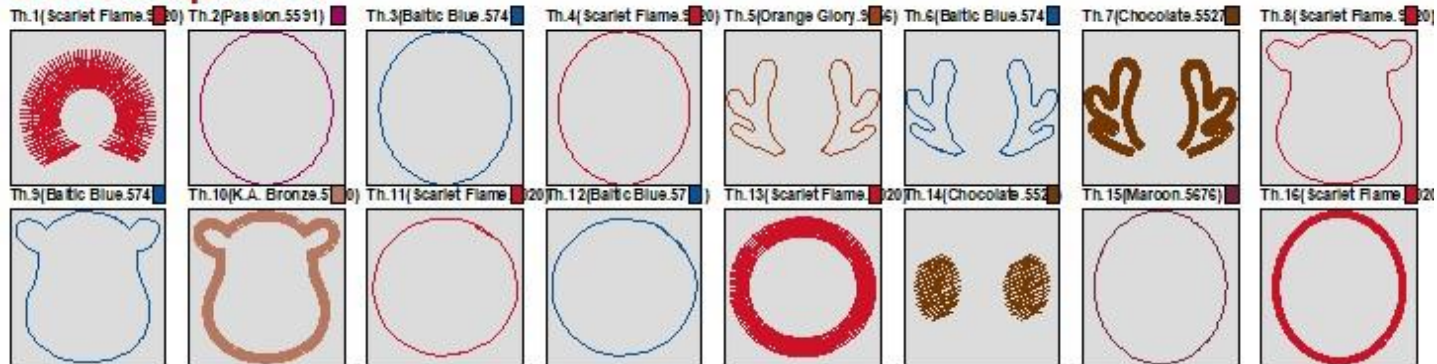
Stitch count: 9,217

### Color Sequence:



### Materials/Cutting Chart

Materials	Number of Cuts & Size
Front Fabric	1 cut at 4.75 x 5.25 inches
Fabric for Antlers	1 cut at 4.25 x 2.5 inches
Fabric for Face	1 cut at 3.5 x 3.5 inches
Fabric for Nose	1 cut at 1.75 x 1.75 inches
Heat-N-Bond-Lite	1 cut at 4.75 x 5.25 inches 1 cut at 4.25 x 2.5 inches 1 cut at 3.5 x 3.5 inches 1 cut at 1.75 x 1.75 inches
Puffy Foam	1 cut at 4.75 x 5.25 inches
Felt-backed Vinyl Tablecloth	1 cut at 4.75 x 5.25 inches
Elastic Ribbon (I used <b>Cousin</b> brand-Walmart)	1 cut at 2.25 inches
Water soluble stabilizer (Cloth type)	Enough for 5x7 inch embroidery hoop

1. Hoop water soluble stabilizer in a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop and attach to machine.
2. Transfer design (NLSEE2405)



3. Prepare materials as indicated in the Materials/Cutting Chart.

Vinyl, felt-backed, Tablecloth

Puffy Foam

Heat-N-Bond Lite

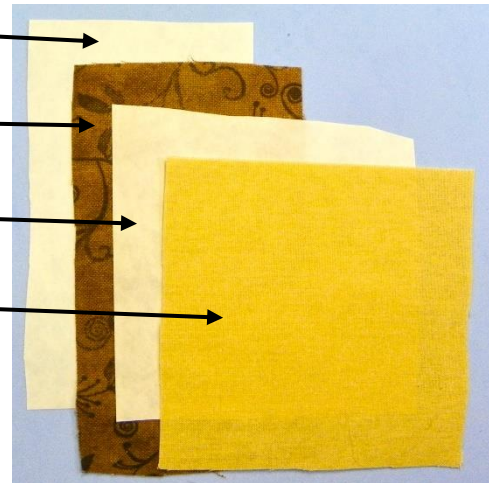
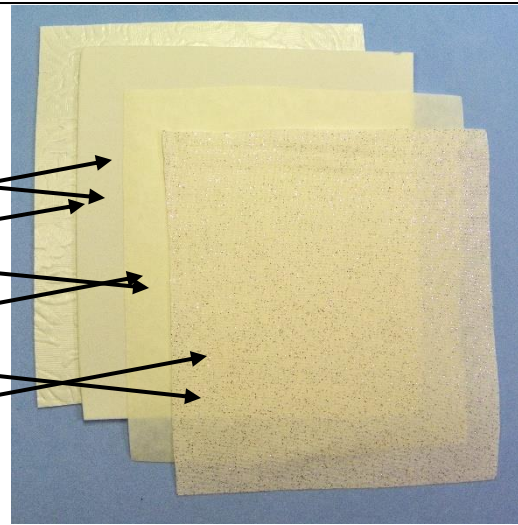
Front Fabric

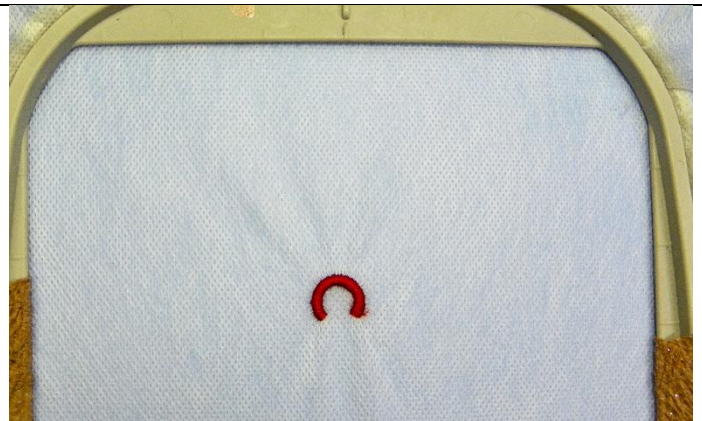
Reindeer Face Fabric



4. Cut the nose fabric and fuse the Heat-N-Bond Lite to the backs of the fabric pieces.

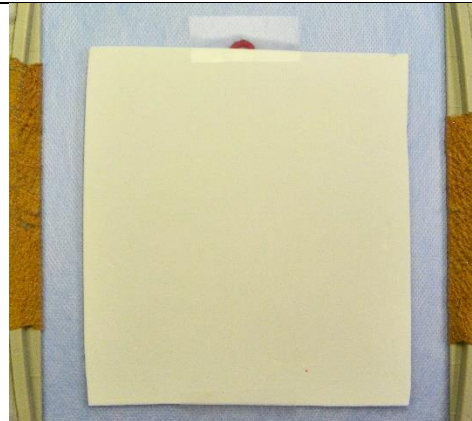
5. Change both bobbin thread and needle thread to the same color.

6. Sew #1 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the "hanger" for the ornament

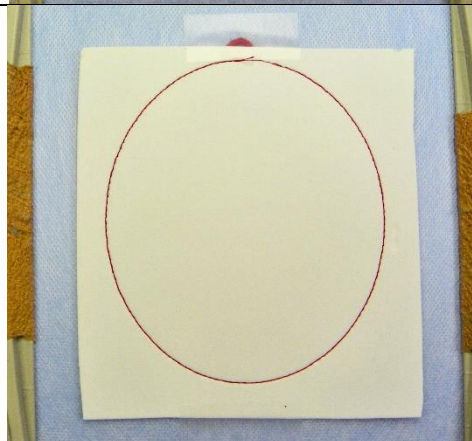




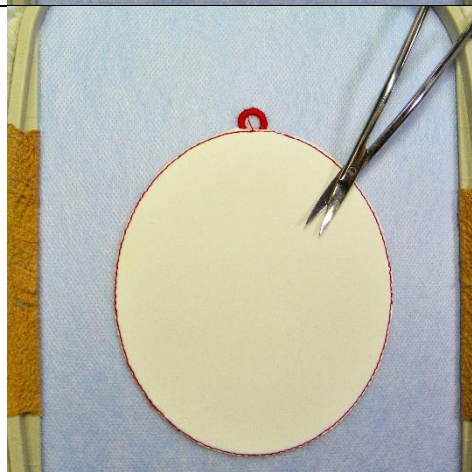
7. Remove hoop from machine, place on a flat surface and place the foam piece over the placement stitches.
8. Secure with tap at the top and bottom-taking care not to place tape in stitching area.



9. You can now change your bobbin thread to white.
10. Return hoop to machine and sew #2 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the foam to the stabilizer. I left the needle thread "red" to make it more visible .



11. Remove hoop from machine, place on flat surface and using very sharp scissors, carefully cut away the excess foam from around the ornament.



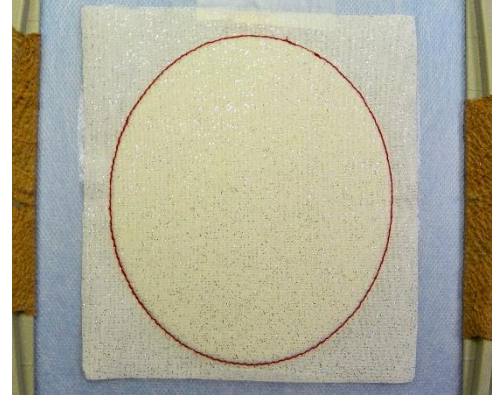
12. Remove the paper backing from the front fabric piece.



13. Place the front fabric (right side up) over the ornament-make sure all of ornament is covered (the hanger does not need to be completely covered) and tape in place at top and bottom.



14. Return hoop to machine and sew #4 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the front fabric to the project.

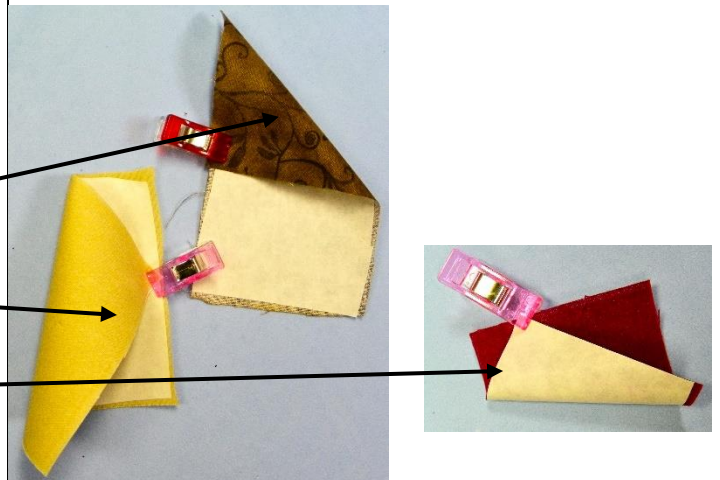


15. Fuse the heat-n-bond pieces to the fabric for the antlers and face.

Nose Fabric



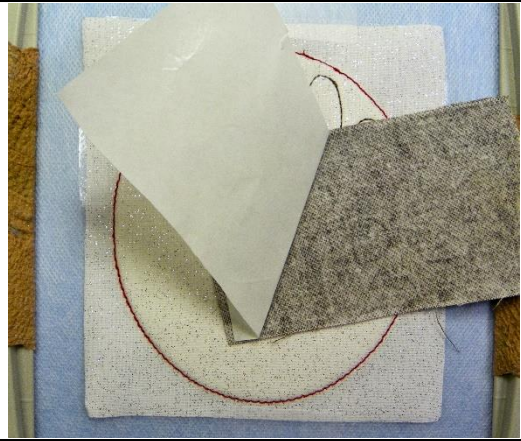
16. Change needle thread to brown (leave bobbin thread white) and sew #5 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the placement stitches for the antlers.

17. Remove hoop from machine and place on a flat surface.





18. Remove paper backing from the antler fabric piece.



19. Place the antler fabric, right-side up, over the placement stitches for the antlers and tape in place.



20. Return hoop to machine and sew #6 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will connect the antler fabric to the project.



21. Remove hoop from machine and, using very sharp scissors, cut away excess antler fabric.



22. Sew #7 in the Color Sequence Chart.

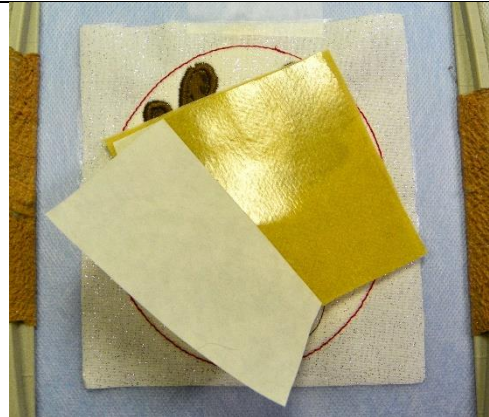
These stitches will create a satin border around the antlers

23. Change needle thread to a lighter brown color.

24. Sew #8 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the placement stitches for the reindeer's face. (Not shown in photo.)



25. Remove paper backing from fabric for face.



26. Place the face fabric, right-side-up, over the placement stitches for the face and tape in place.



27. Return hoop to machine and sew #9 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the face fabric to the project.





28. Remove hoop from machine, place on flat surface and, using very sharp scissors, cut away excess fabric from around the face.



29. Return hoop to machine and sew #10 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the satin border around the reindeer's face.



30. Return hoop to machine, change needle thread to red and sew #11 in Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the placement stitches for the nose.



31. Remove paper backing from nose fabric.



32. Place nose fabric, right-side-up over the placement stitches for the nose and tape in place.





33. Change needle thread to "red".
34. Return hoop to machine and sew #12 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the nose fabric to the project.



35. Remove hoop from machine, place hoop on a flat surface and carefully cut away excess nose fabric.



36. Return hoop to machine and sew #13 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the satin border around the nose.



37. Change needle thread to brown and sew #14 in the Color Sequence chart. These stitches will create the eyes.



38. Remove hoop from machine, place up-side down on a flat surface and trim all thread tails



39. Cut a piece of elastic ribbon 2.25 inches in length, fold in half and place on the bottom of the ornament.  
40. Tape in place-top and bottom of the elastic ribbon. (The tape you use at the top of the elastic ribbon will remain inside the project when it is finished.)



41. Place the vinyl back over the ornament and tape in place in all four corners.



42. Return hoop to machine and sew #15 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will attach the elastic ribbon and vinyl back to the project.





43. Remove hoop from machine and place on a flat surface (right-side down).

44. Using very sharp scissors, cut away excess vinyl from the back of the hoop- **take care not to cut the elastic ribbon.**



45. Turn hoop over and cut away excess fabric from the front of the hoop.



46. Return hoop to machine.

47. Change both bobbin and needle thread to same color and sew #16 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the satin border around the ornament.



48. Remove hoop from machine and project from hoop.

49. Carefully cut away all but ¼ inch of the stabilizer. Leaving the ¼ inch will prevent any stitches from being accidentally cut.

50. Using a wet, folded, paper towel, remove the remaining ¼ inch of stabilizer from around the ornament.



Your ornament is complete and ready to receive a “rolled bill” to make a great gift.
