





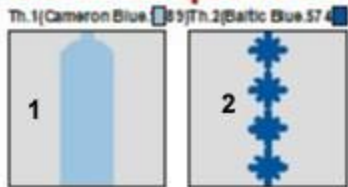

These designs are digitized to be sewn on a **double layer of water-soluble stabilizer**, the cloth-like type, not the plastic-like type. I use Pellon 541 Wash-N-Gone. Other types will work if they are the cloth-like kind.

The Color Sequence Charts for each of the three designs are included below.

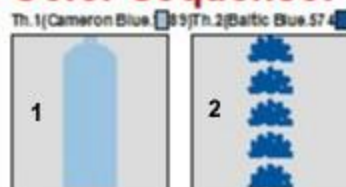

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Hoop two layers of water-soluble stabilizer in a 5x7 inch embroidery hoop and attach to machine.
2. Transfer the design to embroidery machine.
3. Change bobbin and needle thread to the color you want for the lace base.
4. Sew #1 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will create the lace part of the bookmark.
5. Change bobbin and needle thread to the color you want satin designs and sew #2 in the Color Sequence Chart. These stitches will complete the design.
6. Remove hoop from machine and trim loose thread tails from front and back of hoop.
7. Remove project from hoop and trim most of the stabilizer from around the bookmark. Be careful not to cut so close that you cut the border stitches or hanger. It is best to leave about $\frac{1}{4}$ inch to prevent cutting any of the border stitches.
8. Place bookmark in a warm container of water and swish until the $\frac{1}{4}$ inch of stabilizer left around the bookmark falls away.
9. Remove bookmark from water and place on a paper towel. Blot to remove most of the water.
10. Place on a flat surface and make sure bookmark is flat. You can place a paper towel on top of the bookmark and then place a book (or something heavy) on the paper towel to make sure the bookmark dries flat.
11. When dry, your bookmark is ready to receive a ribbon or tassel. These are nice to slip into greeting cards for that special someone or enjoy it yourself in your next good book.
