SUPPLIES:

Tear-a-way or wash-a-way stabilizer

Fabric of your choice – 2 pieces cut a little bigger than hoop

Cotton Batting – 1 piece cut a little bigger than hoop

Thread

Color change 1-3 and last 3 of each design is the same for every design.

Colors in-between depend on the design in the center.

Hoop stabilizer and place on machine.

Stitch CC1 – this is a placement stitch

Now place batting and top fabric over hoop and

Stitch CC2 – tackdown stitch

Stitch CC3 – Decorative quilt stitch

After stitching design remove hoop, turn hoop over and tape back fabric right side facing up on bottom of hoop then place back on machine and stitch next CC(this will be the 3rd from last CC, this stitches the back in place.

Remove hoop and trim fabric close to stitching, place hoop back on machine and stitch next CC this is the satin stitch finish, then very last CC is another satin stitch, depending on fabric, sometimes a second time over will look better.

Stitch as many circles as you like then lay them out in the order you want.



Pin them together



Then satin stitch them together
