

Guidelines for passport cover embroidery

You can use natural or imitation leather for the cover, as well as any other dense material of your choice.

1. Cut out a piece of leather with a size of 13.5 cm X 19.5 cm; two pieces of 5cm X 20cm; a piece of fabric lining with a size of about 20cm X 26cm; a piece of sealer (the sealer is used at will) about 0.5 cm smaller than the blank for the cover on each side (about 12.5 cm X 18.5 cm)



2. Put a tear-off stabilizer into the hoop; embroider the first color that will show the location of the skin (or fabric) for the cover.



3. Fix the blank cover on the top using a glue-spray.



4. Embroider the second color, which will fix the cover on the stabilizer. Next embroider the cat.



5. Remove the Hoop and fix the seal on the back of the Hoop with a glue-spray. Sellotape the top of the seal to secure the lining fabric. Or just fix the lining fabric without a seal.



6. We embroider a zigzag line next. Then remove the Hoop and cut off the remnants of the lining fabric close to the zigzag line.

7. Fix the blanks from the skin with sellotape, as it is shown on the pic.



8. Embroider the zigzag line, and then cut off the excess skin.

9. Embroider the last line that will process the edge of the product.



Remove the cover from the hoop, break the excess stabilizer off. You can carefully process the edges with a lighter if necessary.

The cover is ready! Enjoy the result!
