



ROUND BEAR RATTLE

Hardware:

I work with minky and cotton for the bandana

At each step, take the measurement to have the right size of fabric.

Tearable support, water-soluble support, stuffing, snap button, hand sewing needle and thread

FIRST OF ALL:

Put your tearable support in your frame 10x10cm, for my part I work out of frame with temporary glue.

Start by making ears

EARS

Stop 1: This sewing is done on your support. From this seam, take the measure to know the size of fabric you will need, always protrude from the seams because you must hide the seam, once your fabric cut, put on your support and hold well in place with temporary glue

Stop 2: this seam is done on your base fabric to sew your fabric on your support.

Stop 3: Seam the center of your ears, this seam is done on your base fabric, take the size you will need fabric for the center of your ears

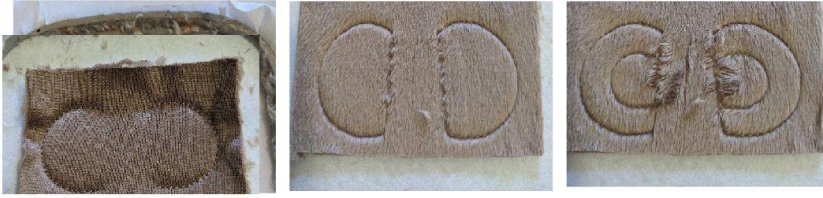
Stop 4: Seam your fabric from the center of the ears to your base fabric. Once this seam is complete, cut off the excess fabric

Stop 5: Bumblebee stitches on the center of your ear, once this seam is finished, take your fabric for the back of the ears and put place against place on your work, hold well in place.

Stop 6: Sewing to sew the back and front of your ears.

Once finished, remove from your frame, cut off excess fabric and set aside.





THE HEAD:

Stop 1: Seam on your stand to show you the location of your piece of fabric for the head. Put your piece to hide the seam that is on your support.

Stop 2: Sewing your piece on your support.

Put your water-soluble support before taking the next step

Stop 3 and 4: embroidery stitch

Stop 5: Seam on your main fabric to tell you the location of the muzzle, take the measurement, put your piece of beige fabric on this seam, taking care to hide the seam above. Hold in place.

Stop 6: Sewing your beige piece of fabric onto your main fabric. Remove excess tissue, put a small piece of water-soluble support on the muzzle.

Stop 7: Bumblebee points all around the muzzle

Stop 8 and 9: Embroidery stitches

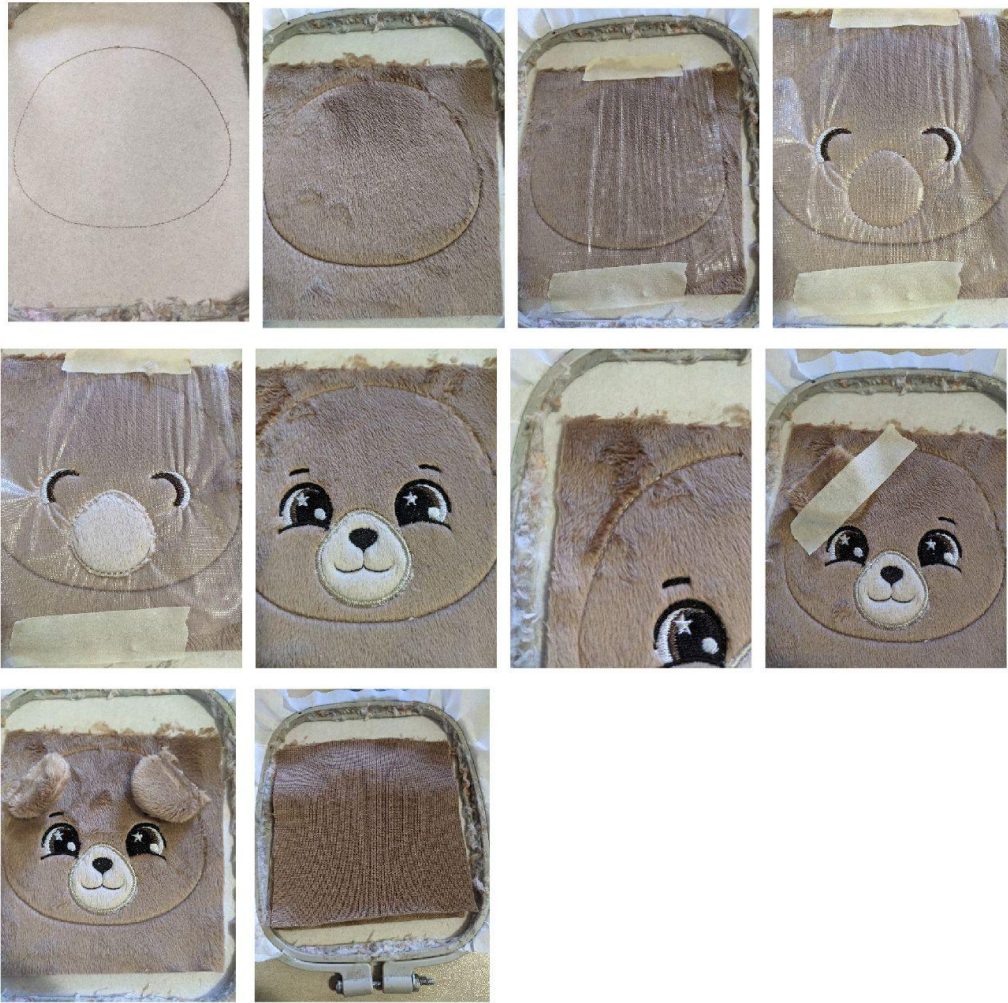
Stop 10: Seam on your support to show you where your ears, once this seam is finished, put your ear place against place and hold well in place before moving on to the next step

Stop 11: Sewing your left ear

Stop 12: Sewing your right ear

Stop 13: Seam to close the front with the back.

Get out of the frame, cut the excess fabric, turn over and put the stuffing



THE RING:

- 1- STOP 1: This fact on the support to tell you where to put your fabric, put your fabric on your support to hide the seam
- 2- STOP 2: this seam is used to hold your fabric on your frame, once this seam is finished, put your piece of fabric, place against place.
- 3- STOP 3: This seam is used to join your two pieces of fabric together. When finished, get out of your frame, cut to the place where there is no seam, be careful to cut in the right place. Remove the excess fabric, return to the place, fill with stuffing and make an invisible seam to join the two ends. [Link to learn how to make an invisible sewing:](#)

Set aside until assembly



Be careful when you go to cut to cut well between the seams



THE BANDANA:

You have 2 methods to do it, either in a 13x18cm frame or print the pattern that I provide and do it with the sewing machine.

For my part I prefer to do it with the sewing machine.

If you want to do it with the embroidery machine,

Arrêt 1 this fact on the support to tell you where to put your fabric. Put on your fabric and do the next step

Arrêt 2 that will fix your fabric on your support. When this seam is finished, take your second piece and put it place to place on your fabric that is on your support

Arrêt 3: assembly of your 2 pieces.

Remove from your support, cut the excess fabric and flip, make the small seam in the top to close the bandana completely and put the snaps.



All you have to do is make the assembly, the ring should already be closed, For the head, position it on the seam of the center of your ring, I put a little fabric glue to keep it in place until I can do the invisible seam.

Once the head is put in place, all you have to do is put his bandana on him and here you have a beautiful rattle that is safe for children.

PS: I always do at least 3 times the invisible seam so that it is really well sewn.
