# ITH Baby in the Moon

The best ITH Baby in the Moon ever! ITH Baby in the Moon is made with fabric, just take all the work out of the project. Make these in less than 60 minutes.

**Skill Level:** Beginner **Time Required:** 01:00 hours

#### **Materials:**

- 5" x 7" 6" x 10" or an extra-large embroidery hoop.
- Fabric in your favorite colors.
- 2.5-ounce Cut-away Stabilizer.
- Repositionable adhesive spray
- Fabric scissors

Designs used in this project:



## Step 1:

For the Baby part tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop, and run color-stop 1 as a placement line.

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with batting with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 2 and 3.



# Step 2:

Run color-stop 4 as a placement line. Cover the placement line with sky blue fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 5. Cut the excess fabric.



#### Step 3:

Run color-stop 6 as a placement line. Cover the placement line with khaki fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 7. Cut the excess fabric.



**Step 4:** Follow the previous step for the hand and the head of the Baby.



Step 5:

Run color-stop 12 as a placement line. Cover the placement line with brown fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 13. Cut the excess fabric.



Step 6:

Run color-stop 14 through color-stop 19.



#### Step 7:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the back of the hoop with white fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray and run color-stop 20.



### Step 8:

Remove the project from the hoop. Cut out the outline of the design, with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



## Step 9:

For the Clouds part tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop, and run color-stop 1 as a placement line.

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with batting with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 2.



Step 10:

Cover the placement line with white fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 3. Cut the excess fabric.



Step 11:

Run color-stop 4 through color-stop 6.



**Step 12:** 

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the back of the hoop with white fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray and run color-stop 7.



## **Step 13:**

Remove the project from the hoop. Cut out the outline of the design, with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



## **Step 14:**

For part A of the Moon tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop, run color-stop 1 as a placement line.

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with batting with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 2.



## **Step 15:**

Cover the placement line with yellow fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 3. Cut the excess fabric.



**Step 16:** Run color-stop 4 through color-stop 6.



Step 17:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the back of the hoop with white fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray and run color-stop 7.



**Step 18:** 

Remove the project from the hoop. Cut out the outline of the design, with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



# **Step 19:**

For part B of the Moon tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop, run color-stop 1 as a placement line.

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with batting with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 2.



# Step 20:

Cover the placement line with yellow fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray, and run color-stop 3. Cut the excess fabric.



Step 21: Run color-stop 4.



Step 22:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the back of the hoop with white fabric with the help of the repositionable adhesive spray and run color-stop 5.



**Step 23:** 

Remove the project from the hoop. Cut out the outline of the design, with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



# Step 24:

We put all the pieces together.



# Step 25:

The Moon will be the center part. With the help of a needle and thread or some type of textile glue, join the parts to form one, join the clouds part to the moon, fix the baby in the center of the clouds, and fix a ribbon for decoration at the height you prefer. Or as the reference image suggests

Use complementary decoration.
