## Cat Keyring IITH Machine Embroidery Design



## **Materials Needed:**

- 2 rectangles of fabric 4x4"
- Fabric Scarps for the applique Key Ring
- Mustache Rope
- 1" x 3" piece of fabric for a ring holder

## **Directions:**


- 1. On the stabilizer embroider the silhouette of the cat.
- 2. Place a rectangle of fabric on top of the silhouette of the cat and stitch.
- 3. Place the fabric scrap for the heart applique and stitch. Trim heart design.
- 4. Take the 1"X 3" piece of fabric and fold in ½. Press. Fold the outer edges into the center and top stitch 1/8" along the open edge. Fold in ½ and attach to the center of the cat's head and hold it in place with a piece of adhesive tape. (The folded piece should be facing down on the cat's head.)
- 5. Take the second piece of 4"X4" fabric and place it with the right sides together on top of the design and stitch in place.
- 6. Remove from hoop, remove stabilizer and trim around the design. Turn right side out.
- 7. Use a small amount of polyfil, fill in the ears first, then the rest of the cat.
- 8. Stitch close.
- 9. With a large eye needle insert a small piece of rope to form the cat's mustache.







I embroider the silhouette of the cat - I put on the stabilizer the first rectangle of fabric and fix it sewing the second track





I take fabric scraps on which I embroider the first trace of the heart, I cut the shape and finish all the embroidery





I insert the ring holder in the center of the head and fix it with adhesive tape



I take the second rectangle of fabric, right sides together, and the position on the embroidery, I fix it with pins and I embroider the last track



I remove the embroidery from the hoop, remove the stabilizer, cut out the shape





Turn over and stuff the kitten with small amounts of cotton wool starting from the ears, close with small hidden points.

Optional: at the center of the nose it is possible to insert a small pieceof rope to simulate the cat's mustache.

Use a needle with a large eye

Complete all the embroidery
Remove the hoop from the embroiderer and turn it over
Cut the bobbin with scissors within each circle
Remove the cut threads as much as possible
Turn right, with a small pincer raises the embroidery as shown in the photo, on all circles
You can choose to leave the ring points or cut out those too
