Instructions for the Cute Puppy Variety Set

Hoop size: Some designs are for the 5x7 hoop, some designs are for the 4x4 hoop

Please Note:

The bobbin thread and the top thread must be the same colour throughout for the satin stich finishes Colour changes for the adding of the backing pieces are just to force the machine to stop.

Materials required for each item:

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front piece. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 3. Fabric for the back piece no design will be stitched on this.
- 4. Masking tape or temporary spray on glue. (I always used the temporary spray on glue)

Small Gift Bag - Front Piece (4x4 hoop)



Small Gift Bag - Back Piece (4x4 hoop)



Materials Required:

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front piece of the gift bag. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 3. Fabric for the back piece of the bag no design will be stitched on this.
- 4. Masking tape or temporary spray on glue.

Instructions

Stitch the back piece.

- 1. Stitch the back of the bag using the same colour thread in the bobbin as the embroidery thread.
- 2. Unhoop, and trim 1cm from the outlines (sides and bottom).
- 3. Trim the top as close to the satin stitches as possible.
- 4. Put aside.
- 5. I only used one colour for all steps.

Stitch the front piece.

- 1. Stitch the design.
- 2. Change the bobbin thread and top thread to be the colour you want the satin stitches to be. (top, sides and bottom).
- 3. The colour changes are now only to force the machine to stop they will all be the colour you want the button holes and satin stitch to be.
- 4. Stitch the top of the bag (satin stitch) and the button holes for the ribbon.
- 5. Stitch the first outline.
- 6. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 7. Turn the hoop over, and tape the back portion (previously stitched) to the hoop, taking care to match the outlines.
- 8. Put the tear away stabilizer of the back piece against the tear away stabilizer of the front piece.
- 9. Turn the hoop over and re-attach to the machine.
- 10. Stitch the next colour to tack the back portion to the front portion.
- 11. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 12. Trim the back potion as close as possible to the tacking stitches.
- 13. Re-attach the hoop to the machine and stitch the final satin stitches.
- 14. Unhoop and trim the sides and bottom as close to the satin stitches as possible.
- 15. Trim the top as close to the satin stitches as possible take care to move the top of the back portion away to prevent cutting it.
- 16. Cut open the button holes and thread ribbon through them.

Large Gift Bag - Front Piece (5x7 hoop)



Large Gift Bag - Back Piece (5x7 hoop)



Materials Required:

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front piece of the gift bag. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 3. Fabric for the back piece of the bag no design will be stitched on this.
- 4. Masking tape or temporary spray on glue.

Instructions

Stitch the back piece.

- 1. Stitch the back of the bag using the same colour thread in the bobbin as the embroidery thread.
- 2. Unhoop, and trim 1cm from the outlines (sides and bottom).
- 3. Trim the top as close to the satin stitches as possible.
- 4. Put aside.
- 5. I only used one colour for all steps.

Stitch the front piece.

- 1. Stitch the design and the words.
- 2. Change the bobbin thread and top thread to be the colour you want the satin stitches to be. (top, sides and bottom).
- 3. The colour changes are now only to force the machine to stop they will all be the colour you want the button holes and satin stitch to be.
- 4. Stitch the top of the bag (satin stitch) and the button holes for the ribbon.
- 5. Stitch the first outline.
- 6. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 7. Turn the hoop over, and tape the back portion (previously stitched) to the hoop, taking care to match the outlines.
- 8. Put the tear away stabilizer of the back piece against the tear away stabilizer of the front piece.
- 9. Turn the hoop over and re-attach to the machine.
- 10. Stitch the next colour to tack the back portion to the front portion.
- 11. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 12. Trim the back potion as close as possible to the tacking stitches.
- 13. Re-attach the hoop to the machine and stitch the final satin stitches.
- 14. Unhoop and trim the sides and bottom as close to the satin stitches as possible.
- 15. Trim the top as close to the satin stitches as possible take care to move the top of the back portion away to prevent cutting it.
- 16. Cut open the button holes and thread ribbon through them.

Bag Topper

Finished Bag Topper



Materials Required:

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front piece of the bag topper. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 3. Fabric for the back piece of the bag topper no design will be stitched on this.
- 4. Masking tape or temporary spray glue.

Instructions

- 1. Stitch the design and the words.
- 2. I stitched the words in the same colour I used for the satin stitches.
- 3. Change the bobbin thread and top thread to be the colour you want the finishing satin stitches to be. From here colour changes are merely used to stop the machine.
- 4. Stitch the outline of the bag topper.
- 5. Remove the hoop from the machine BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 6. Cut a piece of backing fabric bigger than the outlined shape. Use masking tape or temporary adhesive spray to add the backing piece to the tear away side of the hoop. Make sure the outline is covered with the backing piece 1cm bigger all around than the outlined shape. If using masking tape, make sure it is far enough away from the outline stitches so you won't embroider over it. The wrong side of the backing piece must be against the tear away stabilizer, and the pretty side must be facing you.
- 7. Stitch the outline to tack down the backing fabric.
- 8. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 9. Trim the backing as close as possible to the outline tack down stitches.
- 10.Re-attach the hoop to the machine and finish the satin stitches, stitching the outline of the bag topper in satin stitches.
- 11. Remove the hoop, unhoop, and trim the bag topper as close to the satin stitches as possible.
- 12. Fold the bag topper in half, and staple to the top of a bag of sweets or goodies.

Gift Card or Cutlery Holder

This design can be used as a cutlery holder, a gift card holder or a small treat holder.

Finished Card Holder



Gift Card Holder – Front Piece (4x4 hoop)



Gift Card Holder - Back Piece (4x4 hoop)



Materials Required

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front of the gift card or cutlery holder. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 3. Fabric with both sides pretty for the backing it will be partly visible from the front.
- 4. Masking tape or temporary spray glue.

Instructions:

Stitch the front piece:

- 1. Stitch the design.
- 2. Change the bobbin thread and top thread to be the same colour you want the finishing satin stitches to be. From here colour changes are only to force the machine to stop.
- 3. Stitch the top of the front of the gift card or cutlery holder.
- 4. Stitch the outline of the front of the gift card or cutlery holder.
- 5. Unhoop.
- 6. Trim the front piece leaving 1cm all around the outline of the bottom and sides.
- 7. Trim the top as close as possible to the satin stitch.

Stitch the back piece:

- 1. Rehoop with tear away stabilizer and the fabric for the back of the gift card or cutlery holder. You must use tear away stabilizer when stitching this piece.
- 2. The side that will be partially visible from the front must be face up. The back of the gift card or cutlery holder must be against the tear away stabilizer.
- 3. Stich the outline of the gift card or cutlery holder.
- 4. Remove the hoop from the machine BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 5. Use the masking tape to tape the front piece stitched before, on top of the back piece stitched now. The hoop is facing up, the tearaway of the back piece is at the under side of the hoop. The design of the front piece must be facing you the tear away stabilizer of the front piece must be against the fabric of the back piece.
- 6. Make sure the bottom outline and the side outlines of the two pieces are exactly on top of each other.
- 7. A portion of the back will be visible at the top.
- 8. Stitch the next colour it will tack the front piece to the back piece.
- 9. Remove the hoop from the machine BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 10. Trim the front piece bottom and sides as close as possible to the tacked outlines.
- 11. Put the hoop back on the machine, and stitch the last colour the satin stitch to finish the gift card or cutlery holder.
- 12. Unhoop and trim as close as possible to the satin stitch all around.
- 13. Remove the tear away stabilizer from the back.
- 14. Enjoy!

Coasters

All coasters use the same instructions.

Coaster 1 (4x4 hoop)



Coaster 2 (5x7 hoop)



Materials Required:

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front of the coaster. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 3. Fabric for the back of the coaster no design will be stitched on this. If you use a pretty fabric for the backing, the coaster can be reversible.
- 4. Masking tape or temporary spray glue.

Instructions:

- 1. Stitch the design and words (if applicable).
- 2. Change the colour of the bobbin thread and top thread to be the same as the finishing satin stitches.
- 3. Please note, colour changes from here on are only used to force the machine to stop.
- 4. Stitch the outline of the coaster to show where backing fabric should be placed.
- 5. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 6. Cut a piece of fabric to use for the back of the coaster. It must be at least 1cm larger all around the outline stitch. You can use pretty fabric and that will make the coaster reversible.
- 7. Use temporary spray on to glue the fabric, wrong side down, to the back of the hoop. Or tape the fabric to the back of the hoop. Make sure the outline stitches are covered.
- 8. Re-attach the hoop to the machine. The newly attached backing fabric will be under the hoop.
- 9. Stitch the outline to tack down the backing fabric.
- 10. Remove the hoop from the machine, BUT DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 11. Trim the backing as close as possible to the outline tack down stitches.
- 12. Re-attach the hoop to the machine and finish the satin stitches, stitching the outline of the coaster in satin stitches.
- 13. Remove the hoop, unhoop, and trim the coaster as close to the satin stitches as possible.

Mugrug (5x7 hoop)

Note:

The front middle piece is appliqued on top of the hooped front piece

Mugrug



Materials Required:

- 1. Tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Fabric for the front of the mugrug.
- 3. Fabric for the middle piece that will be appliqued onto the hooped piece. The design will be stitched on this fabric.
- 4. Fabric for the back of the mugrug no design will be stitched on this. If you use a pretty fabric for the backing, the coaster can be reversible.
- 5. Masking tape or temporary spray glue.

Instructions:

- 1. Hoop the piece for the front of the mugrug and tear away stabilizer.
- 2. Stitch the background.
- 3. Stitch the outline for the fabric to be appliqued on top.
- 4. Attach a piece of fabric on top of the hooped piece, making sure the outlines are covered. Use temporary spray on glue or masking tape to hold it in place.
- 5. Stitch the tack down stitches.
- 6. Stitch the design and words.
- 7. Remove the hoop, but DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 8. Trim the appliqued piece as close to the tack down stitches as possible.
- 9. Change the top thread and the bobbin thread to be the colour you want the finishing satin stitches to be.
- 10. Stitch the satin stitches on the sides of the appliqued piece.
- 11. Stitch the outline of the mugrug.
- 12. Remove the hoop, but DO NOT UNHOOP.
- 13. Use masking tape or temporary spray on glue to fasten the back piece to the bottom of the hoop, wrong side facing the tear away stabilizer, right side facing you. Make sure the outline stitches are covered.
- 14. Stitch the tack down stitches.
- 15. Stitch the final satin stitches.
- 16. Unhoop, and trim as close to the satin stitches as possible.
- 17. Trim the jump stitches where necessary.
- 18. Enjoy!
