

Materials needed:


Felt or background material of choice.

Felt or Applique material of choice.

Matching threads Stabilizer.



Stitch this block onto Felt or fabric of choice. Stitch according to color chart or choose your own colors.



For Puzzle pieces, you have 2 options.

- 1. Stitch outline design onto stabilizer.
- 2. Place a piece of felt over the design area and stitch the next stitch.


Or

- 1. Stitch outline onto a piece of felt.
- 2. Then place a piece of fabric over the design and stitch the next stitch.

For both options:

Remove design from the hoop and carefully cut around the design and between the double stitch lines to make the individual pieces.

Cut a piece of hook and loop material. Glue the hook side onto the back of the puzzle piece. This will stick to the felt page so that you will not need to use the loop piece.





puzzlepageeaster_bunny2

1: outline placement stitch onto stabilizer.

- 2: Lay a piece of felt over outlines. Use a thread that matches felt. Stitch tack down.
- Black for Eyes and Whiskers
- 4: Pink for Ears and Nose
- 5: Use same thread that matches felt as in Color 2. Remove from hoop and trim around pieces. cut through puzzle area so that you have 2 pieces for the face.

Glue Velcro onto the back of the pieces.

puzzlepageeaster_chick2

- 1: outline placement stitch onto stabilizer.
- 2: Lay a piece of felt over outlines. Use a thread that matches felt. Stitch tack down. This is the egg.
- 3: Lay a piece of felt over outline for chick head.

Use a thread that matches felt. Stitch tackdown.

- 4: Beak. Orange or darker yellow than the chick.
- 5: Black for eyes and nose.

Remove from hoop and trim around pieces. cut through puzzle area so that you have 2 pieces for the face.

Glue Velcro onto the back of the pieces.

puzzlepageeaster_cross2

- 1: outline placement stitch onto stabilizer.
- 2: Lay a piece of felt over outlines. Use a thread that matches felt. Stitch tack down. Remove from hoop and trim around pieces. cut through puzzle area so that you have 2 pieces for the face. Glue Velcro onto the back of the pieces.

puzzlepageeaster_egg

- 1: outline placement stitch onto stabilizer.
- 2: Lay a piece of felt over outlines. Use a thread that matches felt. Stitch tack down.
- 3: With a contrasting thread color, stitch the decorative stitch.

4: With thread that matches felt, stitch the final color, this is the outline and puzzle pieces.

Remove from hoop and trim around pieces. cut through puzzle area so that you have 2 pieces for the face. Glue Velcro onto the back of the pieces.

puzzlepageeaster_title

Colors 1-3 can be stitched in the same color that matches the fabric.

- 1: Outline for applique egg
- 2: Lay a piece of felt or fabric over outline stitch.

Stitch tack down. Remove hoop from machine and trim around egg like you would for any applique.

- 3: Zigzag tack down stitch
- 4: With Contrasting thread, stitch the detailed decorative stitch for egg. 5: With same color or color that matches fabric, stitch the final satin stitch around the egg.
- 6: With color of choice, stitch the word Easter.




Pocket Page


As shown in the pictures below.

Stitch the outline placement stitch onto felt or background fabric. Place a piece of fabric over the bottom square. Secure in place

Stitch the tack down for the square. This is the inside of the pocket, use cotton so that the hook & loop fabric on the back of the puzzle pieces won't stick to the background felt. Remove hoop from machine and trim around like you would for applique

Take a piece of cotton, fold it in half and place it on top of the first piece. Make sure the tops match up.





Stitch the tack down stitch. Remove hoop from machine and trim the 3 sides as you would for applique. You now have the basic pocket. Stitch the Satin stitch around the 3 sides of the pocket.

- 4. Take a piece of felt the width of the placement line. This is the envelope flap. You can cut the bottom of the flap anyway you want. Match the top of the flap with the placement line, overlap just enough so that the tack down stitch stitches on top of the flap. Stitch the tack down stitch. Remove hoop from machine and trim the top of the flap.
- 5. Stitch the final satin stitch for the top of the flap.
