

ITH Christmas Tree

The best ITH Christmas Tree ever! ITH Christmas Tree is made with fabric and wadding, just take all the work out of the project. Make these in less than 60 minutes.

Skill Level: Beginner

Time Required: 01:00 hours

Materials:

- 5" x 7" and 6" x 10" embroidery hoop.
- White, Black, Red, Light Grey, and printed cloth Fabric Sheets Pcs.
- 2.5-ounce Cut-away Stabilizer.
- Repositionable adhesive spray
- Needle and white thread
- Fabric scissors
- Wadding

Designs used in this project:



Step 1:

For the Banner tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop and run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.



Step 2:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.



Step 3:

Cover the wadding with white fabric and run color-stop 2 through color-stop 5.



Step 4:

Cut off the excess fabric.



Step 5:

Run color-stop 6.

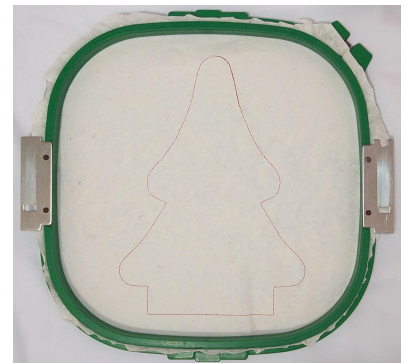


Step 6:

Remove the project from the hoop and cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.

**Step 7:**

For the top of the tree tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop and run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 8:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.

**Step 9:**

Cover the wadding with printed fabric and run color-stop 2 through color-stop 5.



Step 10:

Cut off the excess fabric.



Step 11:

Run color-stop 6.



Step 12:

Remove the project from the hoop.



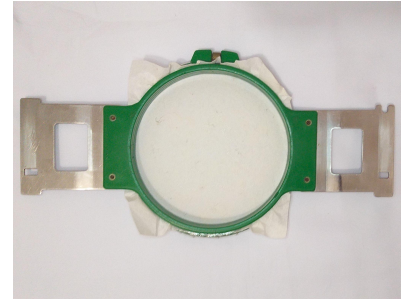
Step 13:

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



Step 14:

For the tree tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop and run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.



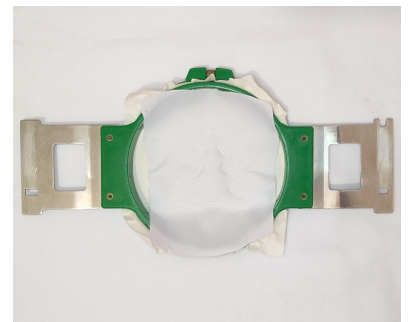
Step 15:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.



Step 16:

Cover the wadding with white fabric and run color-stop 2 through color-stop 4.



Step 17:

Remove the project from the hoop.



Step 18:

Cut out the design outline with sharp scissors, leaving a homogeneous margin.



Step 19:

You will need 3 pieces of the tree.



Step 20:

For the house tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop and run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.



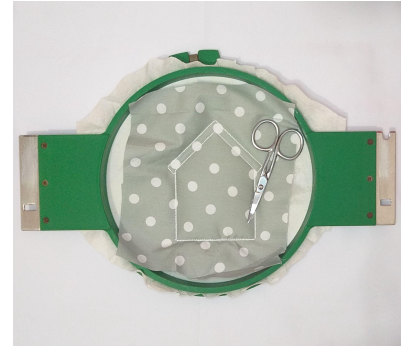
Step 21:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.



Step 22:

Cover the wadding with printed fabric and run color-stop 2 and color-stop 3.



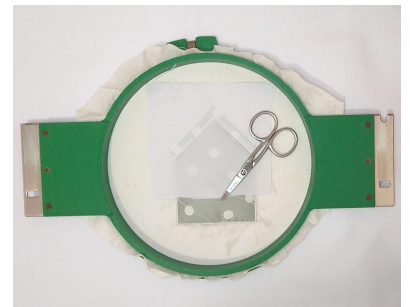
Step 23:

Cut off the excess fabric.



Step 24:

Run color-stop 4, cover the with white fabric, and run color-stop 5.



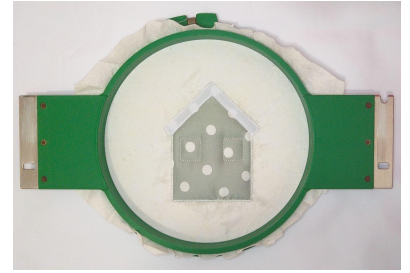
Step 25:

Cut off the excess fabric.



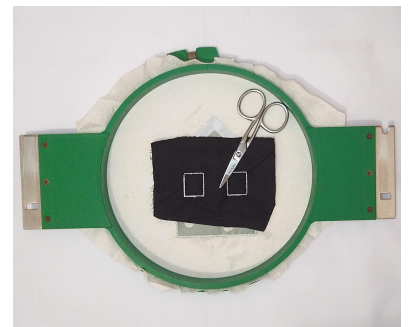
Step 26:

Run the color-stop 6 as a placement line.



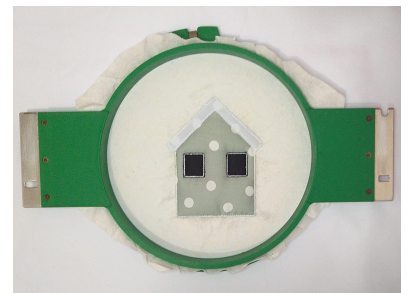
Step 27:

Cover with black fabric, and run color-stop 7.



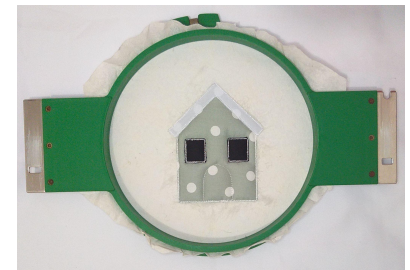
Step 28:

Cut off the excess fabric.



Step 29:

Run the color-stop 8 as a placement line.



Step 30:

Cover with printed fabric, and run color-stop 9.



Step 31:

Cut off the excess fabric.



Step 32:

Run color-stop 10 through color-stop 13.



Step 33:

Remove the project from the hoop.



Step 34:

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.

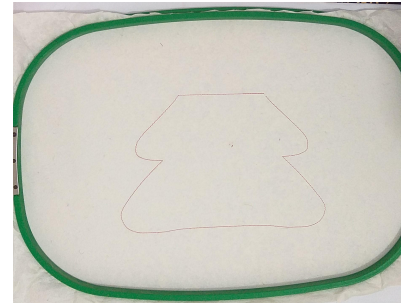


Step 35:

For house 2 follow the same procedure between steps 20 and 34 and save it for later.

**Step 36:**

For the bottom of the tree tautly hoop 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop and run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.

**Step 37:**

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.

**Step 38:**

Cover the wadding with printed cloth fabric and run color-stop 2 through color-stop 5.



Step 39:
cut off the excess fabric.



Step 40:
Run color-stop 6.



Step 41:
Remove the project from the hoop and cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors.



Step 42:
It's time to put the parts of the project together.



Step 43:

With the help of a needle and thread or some type of textile glue, join the pieces as they are arranged in the image. Have fun doing this beautiful project.
