

ITH Baby Bear with milk bottle

The best Baby Bear with milk bottle ever! ITH Baby Bear with milk bottle made with fabric, just take all the work out of the project. Make these in less than 60 minutes.

Skill Level: Beginner

Time Required: 01:00 hours

Materials:

- 5" x 7" and 6" x 10" embroidery hoop.
- White, Khaki, Blue, and Deep Yellow Fabric Sheets Pcs.
- 2.5-ounce Cut-away Stabilizer.
- Repositionable adhesive spray
- Needle and white thread
- Satin ribbon
- Fabric scissors
- Wadding

Designs used in this project:



Step 1:

For the Bottle Part Below tautly hoop a 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.



Step 2:

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.



Step 3:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cover the placement line with wadding.



Step 4:

Cover the wadding with a rectangle of blue fabric.



Step 5:

Run color-stop 2 and color-stop 3 to fix the fabric.



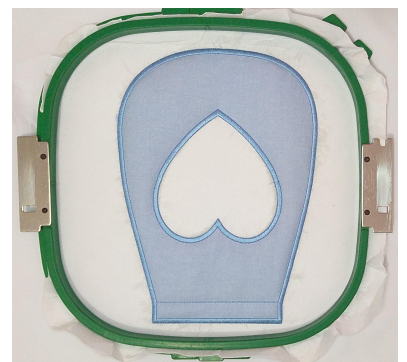
Step 6:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off excess white fabric.



Step 7:

Run color-stop 3 through color-stop 5 to complete the embroidery.



Step 8:

Remove the project from the hoop.



Step 9:

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



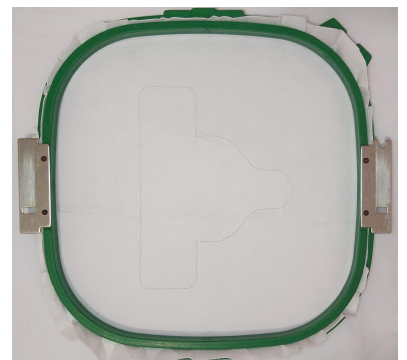
Step 10:

For the Bottle Top Part tautly hoop a 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.



Step 11:

Run color-stop 1 through color-stop 4.



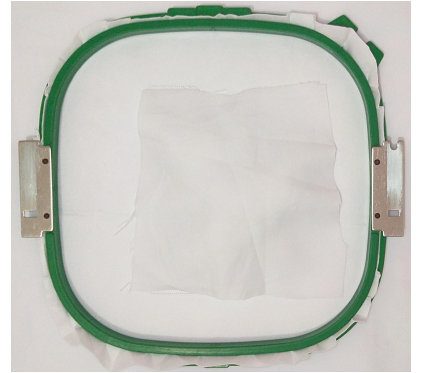
Step 12:

Place wadding covering the right part of the outline.



Step 13:

Cover the wadding with a square of white fabric.



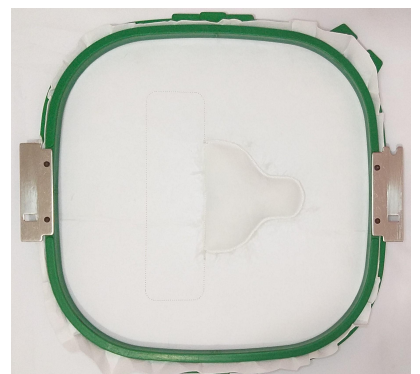
Step 14:

Run color-stop 5 and color-stop 6 to fix the fabric.



Step 15:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off excess white fabric.



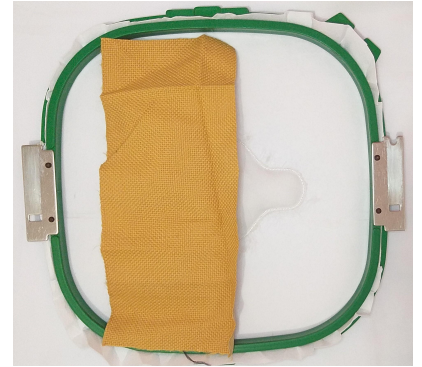
Step 16:

Place wadding covering the left part of the outline.



Step 17:

Cover the wadding with a square of deep yellow fabric.



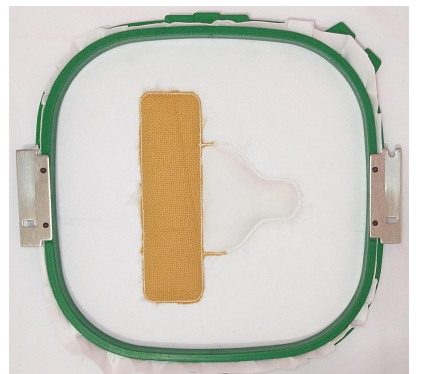
Step 18:

Run color-stop 7 to fix the fabric.



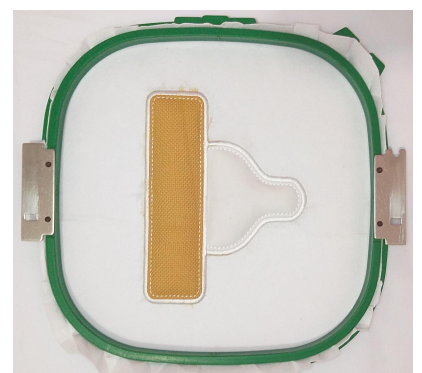
Step 19:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off excess white fabric.



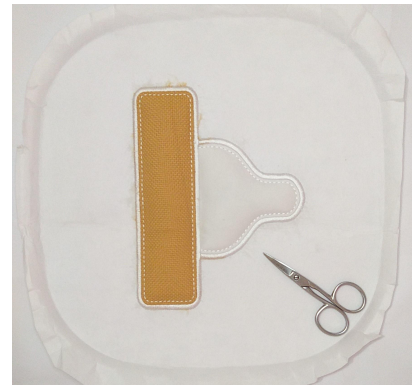
Step 20:

Run color-stop 8 through color-stop 11 to complete the embroidery.



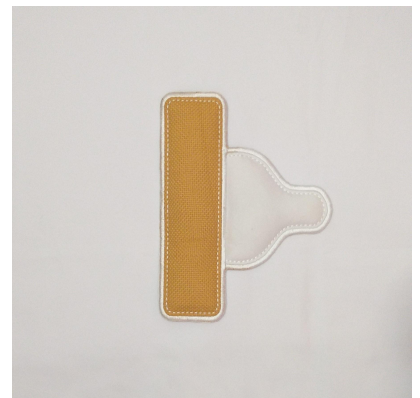
Step 21:

Remove the project from the hoop.



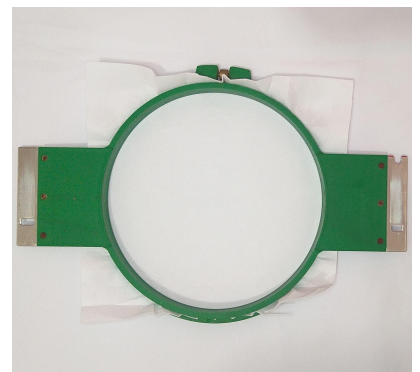
Step 22:

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors, and save it for later.



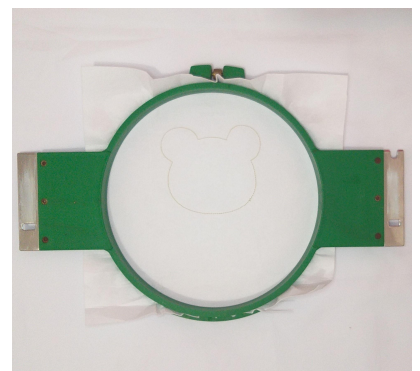
Step 23:

For the Baby Bear tautly hoop a 2.5-ounce cutaway stabilizer in your embroidery hoop.



Step 24:

Run the 1st color-stop as a placement line.



Step 25:

Place wadding covering the outline.



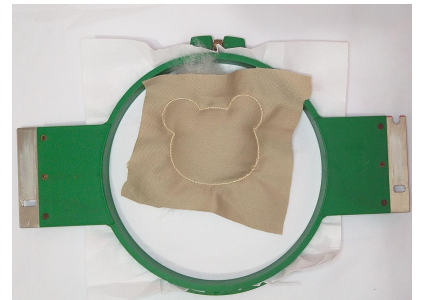
Step 26:

Cover the wadding with a square of khaki fabric.



Step 27:

Run color-stop 2 to fix the fabric.



Step 28:

Run color-stop 3 as a placement line.



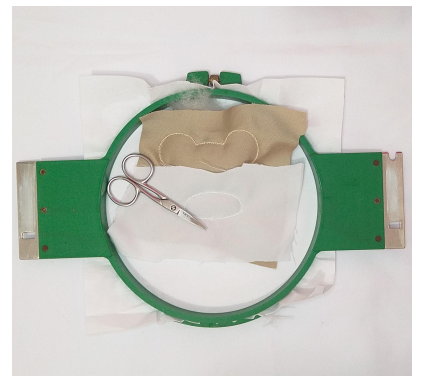
Step 29:

Spray Repositionable adhesive on a rectangle of white fabric and cover the placement line with it.



Step 30:

Run color-stop 4 to fix the fabric.



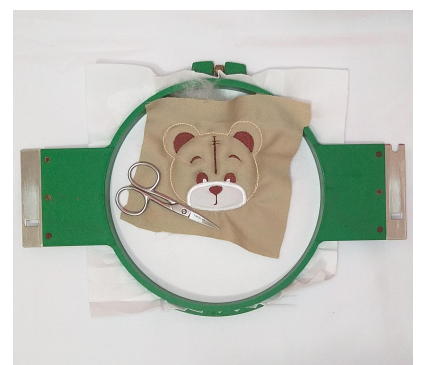
Step 31:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off excess white fabric.



Step 32:

Run color-stop 5 through color-stop 8.



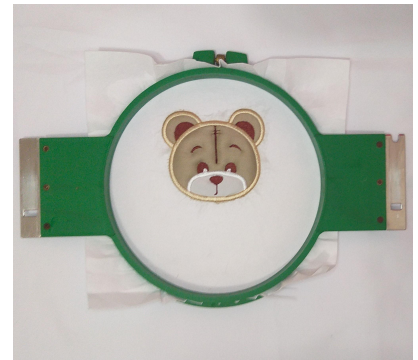
Step 33:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off excess khaki fabric.



Step 34:

Run color-stop 10.



Step 35:

Run color-stop 11 as a placement line.



Step 36:

Place wadding covering the outline.



Step 37:

Cover the wadding with a square of printed fabric.



Step 38:

Run color-stop 12 to fix the fabric.



Step 39:

Remove the hoop from the machine, do not unhoop. Cut off the excess fabric.



Step 40:

Run color-stop 13 to finish the embroidery.



Step 41:

Remove the project from the hoop.



Step 42:

Cut out the outline of the design with sharp scissors.



Step 43:

Assemble all the pieces of the project.



Step 44:

With the help of a needle and thread, put the pieces together as shown in the image, and decorate with a satin ribbon bow and a button. Enjoy.
