

Cute floppy Bunny ears designed by DesignsByRhonda

## Materials needed:

Towel or material for your main project

Stabilizer

Water Soluble Stabilizer if using towels. This goes on the top to prevent the stitching from sinking into the terry cloth.

Embroidery thread colors according to color chart and personal taste

Wash clothes as pictured below

Applique material for the floppy ears

Tape to tape down the floppy ears during stitching



The pattern for the bib shown in display was found on google. There are many bib patterns available for free. Designs By SiCK doesn't sell sewing patterns.

The bib was made by just taking the top portion of the pattern and sewing it on top of the kitchen towel which was cut in half and gathered.

There are 2 basic designs and the design for the ears. Only the actual bunny face is changed.



bunnyears002, bunnyears004, bunnyears006 & bunnyears008

This style is done as a cut out.

Step 1: Hoop your stabilizer. I used cut-away because it is sturdier than tear away and will leave the holes sturdier after multiple washings.

Hoop the material with the hoop or place on top of the hoop and secure using a basting stitch on your machine.

Stitch the 1st Color This is Black for the eyes and the mouth of bunny.

Step 2: Change your thread to the color Pink, or color of choice for the bunny nose.

Step 3: This is the whiskers. Shown they are in grey, but you can do them in colors that match the wash cloth if you desire.


Now for the cutouts for the washcloth.

The next steps can all be done in the same color. I chose white, but you can stitch in any color you choose.

Step 4: This is the outline stitch for the cutout. Stitch

Remove hoop from machine. Do NOT remove from the hoop.

Cut out the inside of the outline as shown. Besure and cut thru the stabilizer if using cut-away.




Step 3: This is the zig zag stitch. This is a seperate stitch to give you the chance to cut a little more if you need too.

Step 4: The Satin stitch. The is the satin stitching that goes around the entire cut out. Your design is now finished and can be removed from the hoop.

For Ears, take the washcloth, take two diagonal corners and pull each end through the open cutout area. They aren't stitched down so that you can use the washcloths on little faces.

Now, we will do the Floppy Ears.

These need to be completed prior to the face as they will be attached to the face design. Bunnyears009



This design can be done all in the same color.


Step 1: Hoop stabilizer. I prefer the tear-away for this.

Stitch the outline stitch onto the stabilizer

Remove hoop from machine and secure a piece of fabric over both ears.

Step 2: Stitch the tack down stitch. This will also stitch the placement stitch for the inner ear. Remove hoop from machine and secure a piece of pink or color of choice fabric over the area.

Step 3: Stitch the tack down stitch around the pink fabric as shown. Remove hoop from machine and cut around as shown.



Step 4: Place a piece of material over the design area as shown in picture. Stitch the next color. Remove from hoop and trim around each ear. Make small clips around the ear so that it will lay flat after turning.

Turn the ear inside out and press flat with an iron. Make sure that your iron isn't to hot. A very hot iron can damage the embroidery thread.



## bunnyears001, bunnyears003, bunnyears005 & bunnyears007



Step 1: Follow the instructions for the Bunny face for the first 3 colors. Now that the face is complete, we will attach the ears.

Step 2: All the next colors can be stitched in the same thread. Stitch the placement line.

As shown on picture below. Place the ears over the stitch line. The ear is stitched longer than it needs to be to make the placement easier. Tape down. It's best if you place a strip of tape both above and below the placement line so that the ear won't move during stitching. Note that the pointer is pointing to the placement line. Be sure that your ear is within that space.



Step 3: Stitch the tack down stitch. Remove hoop from machine and trim the bottom of the ear. Return the hoop to the machine and stitch the final Satin Stitch.

Step 4: Satin stitch to secure the ear to the design.

Remove design from hoop. You now have a cute bunny with floppy ears!



Now you are ready to place these on Bibs, Towels, Hooded towels, Dresses, Shirts.

Stitch on a Placemat and place the napkin for the ears.
